



 - Formal/Informal letter writing




Mathematics

Mathematics continues to be taught in ability sets and each set varies the content of work dependent on the needs and skills of the pupils. In the main pupils will be developing their skills in relation to:

- Angles, properties of 3d shapes, short division.
- Practise and development of all multiplication tables.
- Solving puzzles and problems.
- Fractions, percentages and decimals.


